How to Enter Competitions

The show office is open **Wednesday and Thursday** the week prior to the show, **9:00 am to 5:00 pm** with people available to help you with your entry and answer any questions you may have.

It is important that you read the show book carefully before entry as each section has all relevant details of the different classes, closing date of entry, delivery and collection times of your exhibit. The convenors name and phone number are listed for any queries you may have. Judging is done by an exhibitor number, so entry remains anonymous – unless you are a winner.

CREATING AN ACCOUNT:

You will need to set up your account with Showday Online, the account set up is ONE time only, it will allow you to enter our show in the future and any other show that uses Showday Online. Children can be entered under their parent's (individual entry) account.

Payment on Showday Online is by Credit / Debit card **ONLY**.

For CASH payment, please download an entry form and visit the show office in the week prior to the show commencing.

At the top-right corner of the Showday Online website, click **LOGIN / REGISTER**.

Under the login fields, click create an account (family members can be added under the one account).

Fill out the mandatory fields. This includes your email address, as it will act as your identification. If you do not have an email address, you can still fill out a physical entry form and bring it to the Loxton Show office.

Once you're logged in, ensure you are set to Australia and click the **ALL EVENTS** heading (both at the top-right).

Select the location of **SOUTH AUSTRALIA**, before scrolling down to **Loxton Show PLACING AN ENTRY**.

EXHIBITS

All entrants are encouraged to enter entries via the online program. Those that are not able to enter online can visit the show office and the show office staff will assist with entries. The show office, situated in the Loxton homing pigeon shed (*behind the scoreboard*) is accessible via Bookpurnong Terrace, Mill Gate or Pine Avenue gates from Wednesday 1st to Thursday 2nd October, 2025 unless otherwise stated for a specific section. Exhibits will be open for public display on Sunday from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm and Monday from 9:00 am to 4:15 pm. **Entries for all sections close at 5:00 pm, THURSDAY 2nd OCTOBER, 2025 unless otherwise stated for a specific section.**

Check the section page in the show book or online entry information for specific exhibit receipt times.

Exhibits in the show pavilions may be removed after 4:30 pm Monday. Exhibitors must produce their Exhibitor ID Card for entry or a copy of your online invoice.

PRIZE MONEY

Exhibitors are able to collect their prize money from the show precinct for precinct entries for other entries on presentation of your Exhibitors ID Card copy of your online invoice from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm on the Monday of the show. All prize monies not collected, will be at General Insurance Agencies (GIA) Pty Ltd, 25 East Terrace, Loxton for one calendar month after the show. Any prize monies not collected after this date will be forfeited.

The Loxton Show event will be open to the public from 8:30 am until 5:00 pm on Sunday and Monday. Admission will be by membership ticket or by a gate pass purchased at the gate or from the Loxton Show Humanitix online portal. No admittance without a ticket or pass. Persons wishing to leave the ground's must obtain a stamp on their wrist at the gates for re-admission.

CAR PARKING

There are **no general car passes** available for parking on the show grounds due to council regulations, (there is to be no vehicle movement on the show grounds from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm each day). If you have a disability access card, you can park on the grounds via the Pine Avenue Gate.

FIRST AID

In case of incident or injury, registered Senior First Aid providers will be present at the Loxton Show.

Rules and Regulations of the Loxton Show

ENTRIES AND EXHIBITS

1. All entries and exhibits are subject to the rules and regulations of the Society. Exhibitors should familiarise themselves with the details relevant to the specific sections in which they are exhibiting, located in the general information or on the specific section page.
2. All entrants are encouraged to enter entries via the online program. Those that are not able to enter online can visit the show office and the show office staff will assist with entries. The show office, situated in the Loxton Homing Pigeon Shed (*behind the scoreboard*) is accessible via Bookpurnong Terrace, Mill Gate or Pine Avenue gates from **Wednesday 1st and Thursday 2nd October** or as indicated at the head of each section.
3. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of the dates and times for the closure of entries and receipt of exhibits for their respective sections, and to adhere to them. Late entries and exhibits may be accepted by permission of the relevant section convener and where applicable, the Pavilion Co-ordinator but may not be eligible for judging.
4. Entries sent by post or email will not be eligible for prizes until the entry fees have been paid in full.
5. Exhibits in the show pavilions should be brought to the pavilions during the allocated times for receipt of exhibits (*see specific section pages for details*). All exhibitors must leave the pavilions immediately after their exhibits have been staged. Exhibits may be received at the Secretary's office prior to these times after consultation with the office staff.
6. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of and/or the work of the exhibitor, except displays of implements, machinery and vehicles, shall be grown or manufactured by the exhibitor during the current season, unless otherwise stated.
7. Each article or collection forming one entry must bear an exhibit ticket displaying the section, class number and exhibitor ID number.
8. Exhibitors must not place their name, any previous certificates or any other distinguishing mark upon their exhibits until after the judging, unless otherwise stated.
9. Any person giving the wrong description of their exhibits with the intention of deceiving, or in any way attempting to influence the judging, may be disqualified from exhibiting in any future shows.
10. All exhibitors must place their exhibits in the space allotted to them by the Convener or Stewards. The Show Committee will give every possible facility to exhibitors and ample space for exhibits of every kind will be offered.
11. The Society invites suitable displays or items other than listed in classes. A Certificate of Merit may be awarded if such exhibits are considered worthy at the discretion of the Show Society.
12. Exhibitors are strictly prohibited from touching or tasting the exhibits.
13. If the Rules Committee desires, exhibitors may be required to make a Statutory Declaration concerning their exhibits.
14. All reasonable care will be taken of exhibits at the Loxton Show, but the Society will not be held responsible for any damage, breakage or loss of exhibits.
15. It is a condition of entry into all livestock and animal Sections (A, B, D, H and Yard Dog Championships) that the exhibitor completes an Animal Handling Waiver Form absolving the Society of any responsibility in the event of an injury, damage or death caused by an animal during the Show event and supplies this form with their entry form.
16. A novice is someone that has not won a first prize in the Loxton Show in the section entering.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

17. No animal exhibit is to be removed from the Show Grounds for the duration of the Show event. Refer to specific Section pages for details on removal of animals. Check relevant section pages.
18. Exhibits in the Exhibit Precinct can be removed from 4:30 pm on the Monday of the Show. Exhibitors must present their Exhibitor ID Card or a copy of your on-line invoice to be granted access to the Precinct to remove their exhibits. In special circumstances this rule may be relaxed at the discretion of the specific Convener. Exhibits not removed by 6:00 pm on the Monday of the **show may be stored in the office by prior arrangement for up to a week**. Exhibits after this time will be disposed of.

JUDGING

19. No one shall be permitted to judge a class where they themselves are an exhibitor, or where a member of their immediate family is an exhibitor.
20. No unauthorised person will be admitted to any section while judging is in progress.
21. The judges are empowered to estimate the age of any animal for judging purposes.
22. A third prize may be awarded where there are 7 or more exhibits in a Class; a fourth prize may be awarded where there are 10 or more exhibits in a class.
23. If the judge determines that the quality of the exhibits in a class is not of a sufficient standard, he or she may elect not to award a first, second, third or fourth prize in the class. In this case, special donations or trophies for the class may be held over to the following year.
24. A Certificate of Merit may be awarded at the judge's discretion for exhibits that have not been awarded a prize but are of a high standard. Certificates of Merit do not attract prize money.
25. No prize (first, second, third or fourth) may be awarded equally (excluding Sections A, X and Y).
26. Special awards, trophies or prizes to Exhibitors for the highest number of points gained in Sections or Classes, where they apply, shall be based on the following scale – **first prize** gains 6 points, **second prize** gains 4 points, **third prize** gains 2 points.
27. The judges are empowered to withhold prizes from any exhibit if the exhibitor or person in charge interferes or acts abusively while the judging is in progress. All static displays will be judged on the Sunday morning of the show, with the exception of Sections C, D, E, J and Pa. See the specific Section pages for details.
28. The decision of the Judge shall be final, except where a protest (excluding Section A) is made and upheld by the Rules Committee, in which case the decision of the Rules Committee shall be final.
29. Protests against awards must be lodged in writing with the Secretary before 5:00 pm on the Sunday of the exhibition. Each protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$30. The deposit will be forfeited to the Society should the protest be dismissed by the Rules Committee.

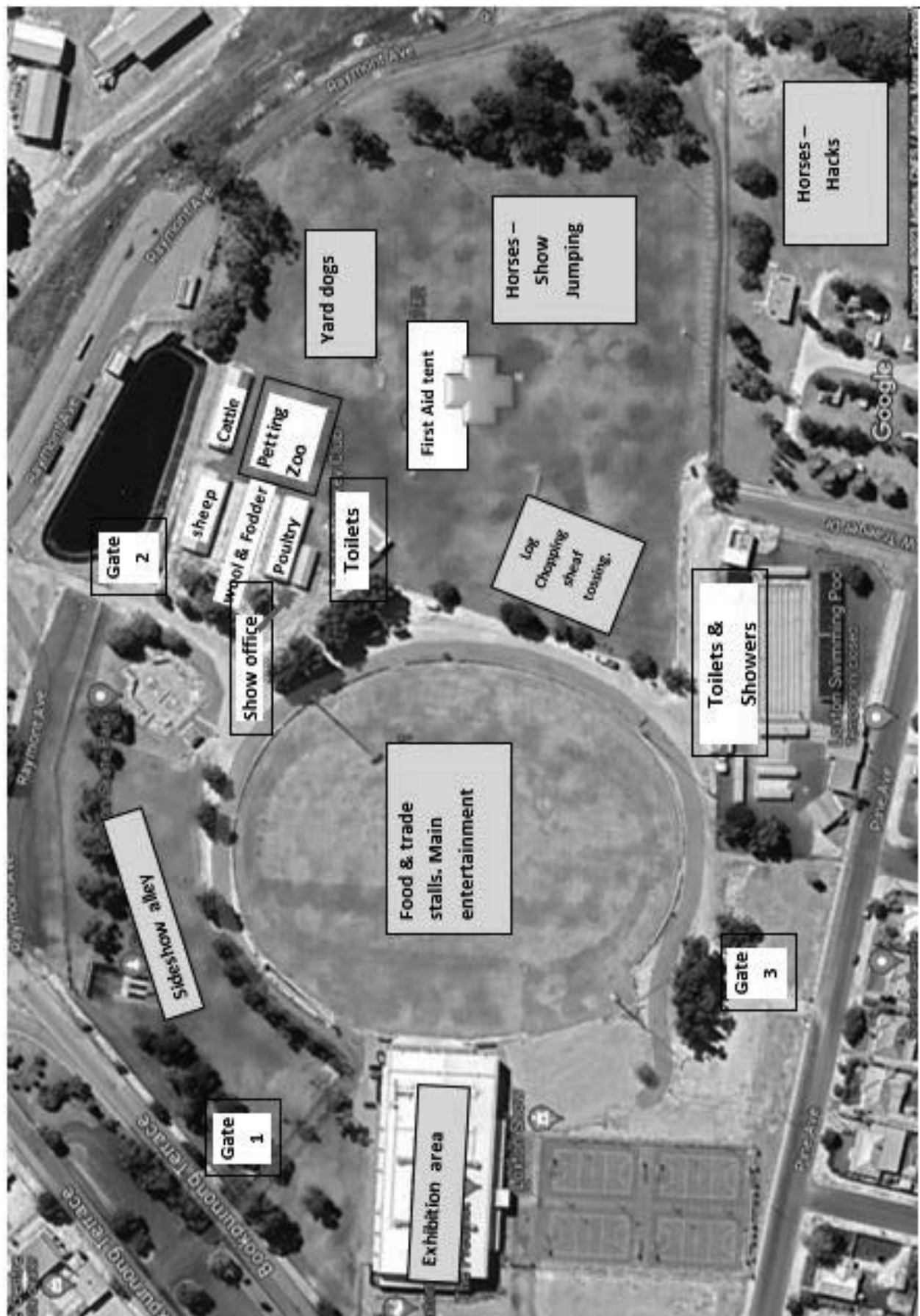
PRIZES

30. Any prize monies uncollected after one calendar month following the show are forfeited.

MISCELLANEOUS

31. The Murray Lands Agricultural Societies' Association award prizes in Horse-in-Action, Sheep, Wool, Poultry, Bantams, Pigeons, Grains, Flowers, Floral Art, Vegetables, Fruit, Jams & Preserves, Cookery, Knitting & Crocheting, Needlework, Crafts, Photography, Art Section held at Association Shows at Loxton, Pinnaroo and Karoonda. The Association reserves the right to award these prizes either in cash or trophy or both. The first counts as three points, a second as two points. In the event of a tie for the highest points, the Exhibitor who has won the most firsts will be declared the winner. To qualify the exhibitor only needs to enter at one Association Show. Confederacies are not eligible to compete or exhibit for Association prizes; the word 'confederacy' in this clause does not refer to or include a registered partnership or firm where all members or partners of the firm conduct their business conjointly.
32. Every exhibitor of Livestock shall be entitled to have a 'handler' present during judging and such 'handler' shall, at the direction of the judge carry out such actions as may be necessary to pacify, exhibit or move such stock to the satisfaction of the judge. This shall exclude the poultry section.
33. In ring events the committee will give all reasonable facilities to exhibitors but will not be responsible for any accidents incurred therein. All animals that are exhibited to be covered for Public Liability Insurance for each occasion they appear. Insurance is arranged by the Society with a cover of \$50,000,000. Premiums, as applicable, are included in the entry fees and paid to the insurers by the Society.
34. Dogs on show grounds **must always be on a leash**. Dogs are **not permitted in the exhibition precinct or animal sheds**.
35. The Loxton A & H Society take no responsibility if a person contracts a contagious disease whilst attending the show. Everyone who enters the showgrounds and the buildings upon the grounds do so at their own risk.

RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

RECIPE

Ingredients

250g butter	60g chopped red glace cherries
250g dark brown sugar	60g mixed peel
5 eggs	60g chopped almonds
250g sultanas	375g plain flour
250g raisins	1 tsp baking powder
200g currants	1 tsp mixed spice
100g dates	200ml sherry or brandy

Method

Chop fruits, mix together and soak in the sherry or brandy overnight. Sift together flour, baking powder and spice. Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add fruit and flour and lastly chopped nuts. Mix thoroughly. Place mixture in a well prepared tin (square) 19-22cm and bake in a slow oven for approximately three to three and a half hours.

Note: Fruit should be cut to the size of currants.

Class 3868 Genoa Cake Championship

Exhibitor's own recipe is used.

It should contain sultanas, currants, cherries and almonds.

There is to be no restriction on the ingredients used.

FAULTS TO LOOK FOR:-

- Carelessly prepared tin – wrinkled lining
- Careless measurement of ingredients – sugar becomes liquid when heated, so care must be taken not to exceed the recipe quantity
- Carelessly prepared fruit – not correctly cut and separated
- Insufficient creaming of butter and sugar
- Eggs not beaten in well after each addition
- Overpowering aroma of essences and/or spices
- Flour and fruit not sufficiently mixed in – leaves streaks and unmixed dry ingredient's
- Carelessly filled tin – work cake well down (Never leave the scrapings from the bottom of the bowl sitting on top of the cake. This will show a pale patch when cut)

- Oven too hot
- Oven too cold
- Insufficient cooking time – the cake will sink in the middle and be very soggy

WHAT THE JUDGES ARE LOOKING FOR IN RICH FRUIT CAKE AND GENOA CAKE:

To judge, cut cake straight across. Tasting wedge to be cut from the center of the cake.

Appearance

Smooth appearance on top, bottom and sides. No sign of shiny, dark, overheated fruit protruding from the surface. The cake should be firm, smooth, fresh and not too moist to touch but not too dry either, preferably with a well ripened patina on the top surface. Straight sides, and a smooth flat top showing even distribution of fruit.

Finish in baking

No bumps, hollows or sunken centers, nor large cracks (a small crack is not a major fault). The cake should cut cleanly, without any crumbs, and without catching and dragging of fruit. There should be no burning or crusty top or sides (caused by too hot an oven or insufficient papering). After the cake is cut, the fruit closest to the outside should not appear to be dark and shiny (caused by over-cooking in too hot an oven). This fault causes a bitter flavour. No air bubbles in finished cake.

Colour

Attractive, even, golden-brown on the top, bottom and sides. A darker colour for the Rich Fruit Cake.

Texture

Firm and fine; it should be moist, not soggy nor dry. The texture should be smooth and even, and the same right through the cake. A well ripened cake cuts cleanly and evenly.

Flavour and aroma

Delicious, and should be a perfect blend of fresh eggs and dairy ingredients, sugar, essences, flour and spices, sherry or brandy and quality dried fruit. Beware of an overpowering flavour or aroma of essences or spices, or the acrid smell of overheated fruit.

Decoration

Do not decorate Rich Fruit Cake with almonds. Genoa Cake may be decorated with almonds.

Presentation

Remove all paper from the cake before exhibiting. No cake cooler marks (cool on upturned cake tin).

JUDGING SCORES: -

Judging scores are based on the following:

50% Appearance

25% Texture

25% Taste / flavour

“A fruit cake, like maturing wine, is greatly improved with age. Many a prize has been won by a cake almost fresh from the oven, but if allowed to keep, a change will develop about the end of the first week. The surface of the cake will start to develop a patina, and the aroma becomes richer.

2. Approximately 15 sheep will be used.
3. Dogs must be kept quiet & away from the area while another dog is competing.
4. Next competitor must be available with his/her dog 10 minutes before he/she is due to compete.
5. At judge's discretion, dogs may be disqualified.
6. Dogs wearing a muzzle will be penalised 5 points.
7. The competitor may retire at any time.
8. Dogs taking excessive time will be rung off (12 mins).
9. Scores from the elimination round will be posted on a board. The winning score will be the aggregate of both runs.
10. The judge's decision is final.
11. Competitors are to leave the gates as found.
12. Competitors may assist the dog in keeping the sheep flowing, but assistance will be penalised.
13. Vaccination certificates must be signed.
14. Score sheets will be available after the finals.
15. The organising committee in conjunction with the S.A. YDA Inc. reserves the right to change ruling and regulations as required.
16. No dog may be substituted for a dog already nominated less than 24 hours before a trial commences.
17. In the event of a balloting being necessary handlers will be notified and asked to advise which dogs are to be withdrawn.
18. If a handler has competed more than twice previously, he/she must be a member of the SA YDA Inc. or another recognised Yard Dog Association before entries will be accepted.
